A Muslim woman's cry for reason. Born in Somalia, the author escaped an arranged marriage, fled to Holland, where she became involved in politics, and a passionate campaign for female emancipation from cultural oppression.

### **Infidel**

*Ayaan Hirsi Ali \$34.95*

Her life story from a traditional Muslim childhood in Somalia to her intellectual awakening in Netherlands, to her life under armed guard in the West.

### **This Side Of Peace**

*Hanan Ashrawi \$43.95*

Essential reading for understanding of the Arab-Israeli conflict by a widely respected Christian Arab in a Muslim male-dominated world.

### **Veiled Courage: Inside the Afghan Women's Resistance**
